FSB CHORALE AND DRAMA

George Bernard Shaw said, "The biggest problem with communication is the illusion that it has taken place."

This is the quote which the FSB drama team, Take 6, uses to open their presentation entitled "Tell It." The title "Tell It" is a reflection of the school's theme for the year. Each year students audition for the drama team and for the FSB Chorale. For those invited to join either team, their work as a choir member or drama team member will be their FSB-assigned Christian service for the school year.

These students work through the fall semester to memorize material, and the Chorale and Take 6 drama team then join together to fashion a 45-50 minute program featuring humorous skits, pantomime, original dramatic pieces, choir numbers, and dramatic Scripture readings all centered around FSB's yearly theme. Then, they hit the road!

Throughout the spring semester (Jan-May), students in the FSB Chorale and Take 6 get to

perform in a variety of venues ... i.e. local churches! They take their presentation on the road to churches within a few-hour radius of the school. It's a great way for churches in the area to learn about FSB, interact with our students, and have something unique for their Sunday morning or evening service.

Frontier students are actively involved in a variety of ministries through their Christian service assignments. Some students are matched with a children's ministry or teaching ministry in a local church. The Frontier Chorale and Take 6 drama team are ministry opportunities for those students who have creative, musical, and performing arts gifts and abilities.

We are thrilled that students can use their gifts to communicate biblical truth through skits and songs and bless and encourage the local church. Watch for them at a church near you! THE ONE-YEAR PROGRAM AT FRONTIER SCHOOL OF THE BIBLE

Frontier is a three-year Bible Institute, awarding an Associate of Arts Degree after three years of study and a Bachelor of Arts Degree after a fourth-year internship in ministry. While our multi-year program equips students more fully for ministry, our One-Year Program provides an essential biblical foundation for those who choose to enter the workforce, the military, or another college. Receiving a firm foundation before taking the next step in life is crucial for students. A student who knows WHAT he believes and WHY, based on the truth of God's Word, will be able to more firmly stand in the constantly changing culture and will be able to help others who are struggling. Students that complete the course of study for this program with a GPA of 2.0 or higher will receive the Basic Christian Training Certificate.

Classes for this program include:

Bible Doctrine 1

An introductory study of the fundamental doctrines of the Christian faith, acquainting the student with the major themes of Bible truth: God, Scripture, Angels, Man, Sin, and Salvation.

Bible Doctrine 2

A continuation of the material described in Doctrine 1, covering Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, the Church, and things to come.

Personal Evangelism

Students learn the Biblical basis, philosophy, and objectives of leading others to Christ. Various methods of evangelism and follow-up are evaluated. Special emphasis is placed upon the true nature of the gospel of grace and how to overcome men's objections.

Introduction to Missions

A survey of the Biblical basis for missions, the call, motives, and preparation of missionaries, current methods, needs, and some outstanding missionaries of the past.

Old Testament Survey

An overview of the entire Old Testament, based on a book-by-book analysis. Introductory material to each book is given and the content brought into focus.

New Testament Survey

An overview of the entire New Testament, based on a book-by-book analysis.

The Book of Genesis

A review of the book of Genesis beginning with the seven literal days of creation and including the fall of man, the flood of Noah, and the inception of the Jewish nation.

Bible Study Methods

Designed to show the student how to study the Word of God for better understanding.

The Gospel of John

An examination of the texts that deal with the deity of Christ and a look at the miracles of Christ which authenticate His claim to be the Son of God.

Contemporary Issues

A course designed to equip the student in the Scriptures to discern truth from error, to develop a practical blueprint for moral absolutes, and to communicate effectively from a Christian worldview regarding the major issues of today.

Victorious Christian Living

This course is an intensive look into the Lord's provision for every believer to walk daily in triumph over sin, self, the world system, and Satan. The approach to this truth is deeply practical.
